



The most important figure buried here is General D. Chłapowski († 1879) - Napoleon's adjutant, precursor of modern agriculture, one of the commanders of the November Uprising and leading social activists of 19th-century Greater Poland region. His son Kazimierz († 1932) fought for the independence of the Polish Church by organizing, among others national rallies. Dezydery († 1855) was a member of the Poznań Society for the Advancement of Arts and Sciences, a sworn judge at sessions of the Land Court, he also participated in the meetings of the Central Economic Society. Stanisław († 1930) fought in the Polish-Bolshevik war, he was awarded the Cross of Valor. His brother Juliusz († 1920) served in the 16th Uhlans Regiment. He was posthumously awarded the Virtuti Militari Cross. Another brother, Zdzisław († 1920), fought in World War I, and during the Wielkopolska uprising he belonged to the People's Guards. He commanded the 15th Uhlans regiment. He was twice decorated with the Cross of Valor. The wife of Great Prince Constantin, brother of Tsar Aleksander Romanow - Joanna and Zofia Koźmian, the wife of Jan, the creator of the concept of organic work, are also buried in Rąbin. The Kopaszewo Way of the Cross foundation, which was built on the funeral procession way between Kopaszewo and Rąbin, is connected with Zofia's grave.

Members of the Rąbiński family are buried inside the temple, whose magnificent epitaphs are placed in the presbytery. In the side chapels, the church's patrons and several parish priests were buried. Originally there was a parish cemetery around the building. In 1775 and 1792, the people buried there were exhumed and their remains were deposited on the northern side of the church.

The necropolis was renovated in the 1990s. In 2020, the Foundation "Bonum adipisci" - Strive for good, initiated together with the parish of St. Apostles Peter and Paul further, thorough restoration work.

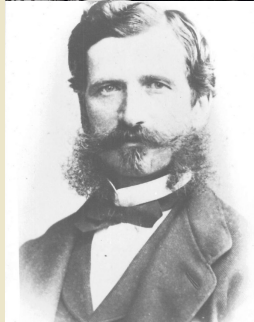
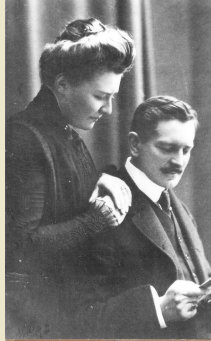
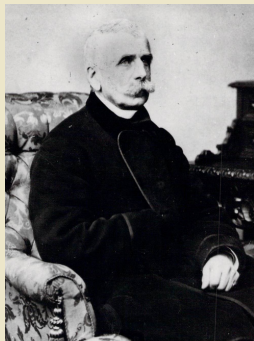

The church cemetery in Rąbiń is the resting place of several dozen members of the Chłapowski family, as well as people of merit, including the long-time steward of the property in Rąbin, Stanisław Chłapowski's milk mother, a doctor who looked after typhus patients in the Chłapowski estates, a teacher for their children or a social work companion of Antonina, the general's wife. The cemetery is also the resting place of the Niklas, Wytyk and Knychaća families, who materially supported the church and the parish. Extremely simple, unadorned tombstones commemorate the representatives of three lines of the family - the Turew, Kopaszewo and Szoldry lines. There are also unmarked tombs here.
